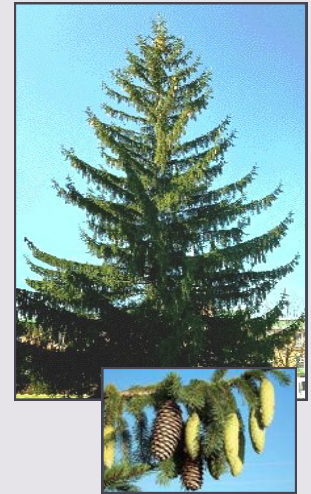
White Spruce

- Christmas trees, windbreak
- Short, green needles
- Slow to moderate growth to 100'
- Well-drained soil to seasonal wetness
- Significant food/nesting source for wildlife
- Low deer browse
- Native to New York



White Pine

- Reaches up to 140'
- Soft needles, 2.5" - 5"
- Cones 4" - 8"
- Grows in a range of soils
- Used for timber
- Christmas/ornamental
- Wildlife habitat
- Windbreaks and screens
- Erosion control



Norway Spruce

- Windbreak, screening, lumber, wildlife habitat
- Branches droop with maturity
- Moderate growth to 90'
- Well-drained soil to seasonal wetness



Fraser Fir

- Popular Christmas tree species
- Dark blue-green needles
- Pleasant scent
- Reaches maximum height of 80'
- Intermediate in shade tolerance
- Likes rocky to sandy soils that are acidic



American Larch

- Short, soft needles
- Deciduous, golden in fall
- Aromatic
- Fast growth to 50'
- Moist upland or boggy soil
- Susceptible to deer damage
- Benefits wildlife
- Native to New York



Sugar Maple

- Maple syrup, timber
- Red, orange and yellow fall colors
- Moderate to fast growth to 100'
- Well-drained soil
- Susceptible to deer damage
- Important to wildlife
- Native to New York



Native Birch

- Conservation plantings, wildlife habitat
- Landscaping; attractive white bark peels
- Moderate growth to 100'
- Moist to wet acidic soil
- Sun to shade
- Low susceptibility to deer damage
- Native to New York



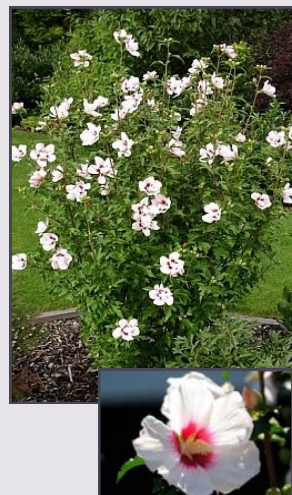
Red Oak

- Low maintenance
- Best in full sun
- Shade tree
- Dry to medium soil
- Tolerates drought
- Durable and long-lived
- Moderate to fast growth
- Grows to 50'-75'
- Fruit is the acorn



Elderberry

- Grows to 6'-12'
- Moist, well-drained soil
- Used in streamside buffers
- Wildlife habitat
- Wildlife food source
- Fruit high in Vitamin C
- Fruit used in wine, jam, syrup and pies



Rose of Sharon

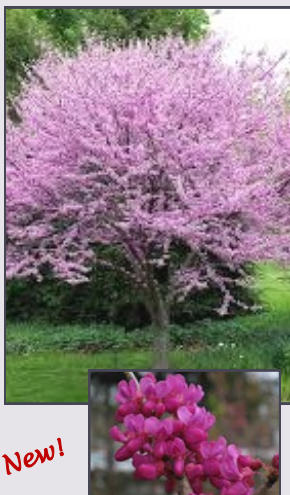
- Windbreaks, borders, attracts birds
- Red, white, lavender blossoms late summer to early fall
- Fast growth to 8-12'
- Moist, well-drained soil, full sun
- Spreads

White Flowering Dogwood

- Reaches height of 25'
- Full sun and partial shade
- Moist soil conditions
- White flowers in spring
- Glossy red fruit attracts songbirds
- Seed, fruit, flowers, twigs, bark and leaves all used as food by animals



New!

Red Bud

- Grows to 20-30' high with 25-35'spread
- Grows 13-24" per year
- Grows best in moist, well-drained soil
- Tolerates acidic or alkaline soils, heavy clay
- Full sun to light shade



Common Lilac

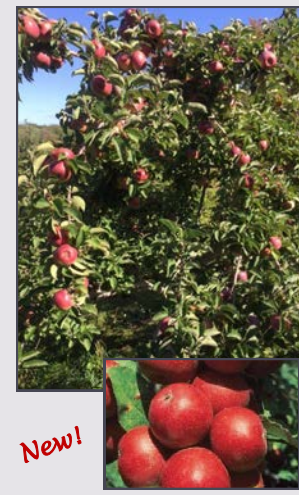
- Ornamental
- Attractive, sweet smelling flowers bring birds, butterflies and bees
- Non-invasive
- Hardy
- Grows to 15'

Jersey Blueberry

- Hearty, healthy species
- Tall, attractive shape
- Resists cracking
- Cold-hardy
- Ripens in August
- Self pollinating
- Full sun
- Loamy, well-drained soil
- Medium-large berry

Macoun Apple

- Cross between McIntosh and Jersey Black
- Mid-to-late blooming
- Cold-hardy
- Ripens in September
- Pollinator needed
- Full Sun
- Well-drained soil
- 2-5 years to bearing
